#### **The Need**

Medicines & Therapeutics have reduced the disease burden considerably. Though they are Life saving & quite often, improve the Quality of Life of the diseased, they may still cause some undesirable effects also defined as Side effects or Adverse Drug Reactions. The 1962 Thalidomide (Phocomelia) tragedy & day to day, GI disturbance seen after antibiotic administration are well known examples, depicting the two extremes of same spectrum.

The first step towards preventing them is to identify them – treat them & report them, so that appropriate Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategies (REMS) might be planned. This very scientific activity encompasses the essence of Pharmacovigilance.

It is also one of the cheapest way to develop real world clinical pharmacology data. It can help us identify how the drug behaves or affects, when administered for emergency or nonlabelled use, in those with co-morbidities & at extremes of age – the pediatric & geriatric subjects, or during physiological states like pregnancy & lactation etc.

This is also the Prerogative of Pharmacovigilance programme of India, being in existence in our country since last decade. One of the objectives of the programme is creating awareness, train the Physicians, Paramedical personnel & Pharmacists, all alike.

The hands-on training & workshop is designed to achieve the desired goals, by Inculcating the culture of Reporting these ADR's in the budding medical professionals – the MBBS Undergraduates & PG residents, who have read Pharmacology & get good exposure to the at

risk population – the patients. **It is also designed to develop future trainers among the Postgraduates residents in Pharmacology, who are likely to lead the programme further.**

**The Objectives – “Catch them Young”  
To equip Medical UG & PG with basic practices like reporting of suspected ADRs,  
Causality assessment.**

To provide the participants, Hands-on training to basic practices like,

- How & whom to report suspected ADRs?
- How to do causality assessment?
- How to prevent them – Risk evaluation & Mitigation Strategy planning
- How to report, with the help of, “ADR Reporting app”.

**Expected OUTCOME**

After successful completion of the workshop,

- Participants would be able to report suspected ADR's and strengthen the Pharmacovigilance programme of India, with more frequent & better quality data.
- Participants will be recognized as, “Drug Safety Volunteers”, who will spread the need & Objectives of PvPI, in their respective departments and Institutions.
